The Repealing and Amending Bill, 2022

Parliament proceedings | Bill to repeal over 60 old laws, rectify error in one introduced in LS



DELHI | The Repealing and Amending Bill, 2022, seeks to repeal enactments which have ceased to be in force, or have become obsolete or for which their retention as separate Act is unnecessary.

The Repealing and Amending Bill, 2022, also aims to correct a "patent error" in another law by replacing certain words.

Piloted by Law Minister Kiren Rijju, the bill is one of the periodical measures by which enactments which have ceased to be in force, or have become obsolete or their retention as separate Act is unnecessary, are repealed.

Such bills also correct defects which are detected in laws. The bill proposes to repeal

Maharashtra | By Eve Thomas: Maharashtra has become a stronghold of illegal schools. Ignoring the lives of the students in Maharashtra, many schools are being run illegally by violating the rules. There is no fire safety system in these schools. The schools in Maharashtra have not been constructed as per the safety norms included in the National Building Code of India 2005.

These play way, preschool, senior schools, junior schools, coaching centers, collage, Child Care, Baby Sitting, and Day Care Center, etc are being run in shops and residential building.

All these schools do not have fire NOC. It is illegal to run a school without a fire NOC, but despite this many schools in Maharashtra are being run in violation of the law.

In Maharashtra, the order of the Supreme Court are being flouted continuously.

90% private and government schools in Maharashtra are defy the order of the Supreme Court. Schools are being run without fire safety equipment in connivance with the officials of municipal corporations, Municipality, nagar panchayat, CIDCO, Fire

Department and Education Department etc. These schools do not follow the directions given by the Supreme Court.

Due to inadequate fire safety measures, the School Education Department continues to allegedly put lives of children enrolled in government and private schools at risk in violation of the Supreme Court guidelines of 2009.

Countless illegal schools running in Maharashtra are examples of involvement in corruption of CIDCO, Fire Department, Education Department, municipal corporations, Municipality, nagar panchayat and Fire Department.

The apex court had directed installation of fire extinguishing equipment and adoption of other safety measures in all government and private schools across the country. Pertinently, the Supreme Court had ordered fire safety measures in all government and private schools across the country to avoid recurrence of incidents like the July 2004 school fire in Tamil Nadu that claimed the lives of 93 children. **The following fire safety measures are mandatory in**



schools as ordered by the Supreme Court:

FIRE SAFETY MEASURES IN SCHOOLS:

1. Provision of adequate capacity and numbers of fire extinguishers of ISI marks to be provided in eye-catching spots in each block of the school.
2. First Aid kits and necessary medicines should be readily available in the school.
3. Provision of water tank and separate pipe line from the tank with hose reel to the ground floor and first floor.
4. Fire fighting training to all teachers and students from X to XII standards.
5. Fire Task Force in every school comprising of Head of the institution, two teachers / staff members and one member from the Fire and

Rescue Department should be constituted. The Fire & Rescue Department member shall monitor and make fire safety plan and conduct inspections once in every three months.

6. Display of emergency telephone numbers and list of persons to be contacted on the notice board and other prominent places.
7. Mock drills to be conducted regularly. Fire alarm to be provided in each floor and for rural schools separate long bell arrangement in case of emergency.
8. All old electrical wiring and equipment shall be replaced with ISI mark equipments and routine maintenance conducted by the School Management in consultation with the Fire and Rescue Department.

9. No High Tension lines should run inside or in close proximity to the school. Steps must be taken to shift them if they are already there.
10. The Fire and Rescue Department shall frame guidelines with "DOS and DON'Ts" for schools and issue a fitness certificate, which shall be renewed periodically.

CLEARANCES & CERTIFICATES:

1. Every School shall have a mandatory fire safety inspection by the Fire and Rescue Services Department followed by issuance of a 'no objection certificate' to the School as a mandatory requirement for granting permission for establishing or continuation of a School.
2. An Inspection Team consisting of experts like a Civil Engineer, a Health Officer, a Revenue Officer, a Psychologist, a Fire Officer, a local body officer and a development officer besides the educational authorities shall carry inspection and assessment of infrastructural facilities before the commencement of each academic year. The Team shall submit its Inspection Report to the concerned district Chief Educational Officer.
